RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom Ahverim of Temple Beth Sholom:

My wishes to you all for a joyous and meaningful Hag Shavuot which begins Sunday night June 1st. We will be here at the synagogue for our annual Tikkun Leyl Shavuot, 6:30 pm, a night of learning and cheese cake!

What I like to do as we are facing the long, hot summer days is to share with you a long list of books that I know you would enjoy reading. Get some lemonade, settle down in your favorite seat/chair/couch and enjoy the sunshine days for reflections and learning.

Here are my recommendations:

- 1 At the top of the list, Douglas Murray's new book/bestseller, *On Democracies and Death Cults: Israel and the Future of Civilization*. A brilliant review of what is at stake for the world, not just Israel and the United States, examining the truth of October 7th and how Israel is fighting for all who cherish freedom.
- 2 Next is Melanie Phillips' latest book, *The Builder's Stone: How Jews and Christians Built the West-And Why Only They Can Save it.* Another magnum opus on what is going on in the world and the battle for the survival of Israel and the Jewish people, a philosophical, political, historical review of what Judaism in particular means to us all in the fight for truth over darkness and hatred.

Then there are these others:

- Assyria, by the author Frahm. This is an interesting history of the world's first Empire, Assyria, that dominated the world for almost one thousand years. The intersection with Israel and Judea's history as we read in the Bible, is fascinating. This is an outstanding scholar, and we certainly recount 722 BCE when Assyria destroyed the northern kingdom of Israel, 701 BCE, when they stopped their siege of Judah, and 612 BCE, when Babylonia conquered Assyria, leading to Nebuchadnezzar's destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem in 586 BCE.

- The History of the Bible, by one of our great Distinguished Speakers, Dr. John Barton, Oxford University. A great introduction to what the Bible is, when it was written, and why its



truths are with us today and forever.

- We Who Wrestle With God, Dr. Jordan Peterson, is an interesting running commentary on some Biblical texts from one of our most interesting psychologists. That's the aim: the psychological truths of the Bible, in particular the Genesis stories.
- Paula Fredriksen's latest *Ancient Christianities*, on how Christianity remained a hodgepodge of different religious groupings until at least the 6th century. Anything you read from this most eminent scholar of early Christianity is priceless. Fredriksen was born and raised as a Christian and recently converted to Judaism.
- Anthony Julius, perhaps the UK's most famous lawyer, is also a scholar of Jewish history and Judaism and his latest book, *Abraham*, is a jewel of what we know now to be the history of Abraham, how important his contribution has been to the development of Judaism and how his words and life have been interpreted by Jewish scholars and philosophers through the ages. Fantastic.

That should give you all plenty to do this summer! Happy reading...there are many more books I could suggest, so if you are interested in any particular period of study, Jewish or non-Jewish material, including world history, American history, and more, just ask and I'll try to guide you to the best sources.

Enjoy the summertime for reflection and intellectual growth!

CANTOR'S MESSAGE



Shalom Haverim,

I cannot believe I'm sitting here, in my TBS office, almost a year into being your cantor. It just doesn't feel real. I look back on this past year with Temple Beth Sholom and am grateful to all congregants for the opportunity to serve as your cantor each and every day. Writing these articles seems to always put me in a reflective mood. With the writing of this one falling during Passover, so many thoughts

crossed my mind, but gratitude for the opportunity this shul has given me, in addition to all the ways staff, board members, and congregants have gone above and beyond, are top of my mind. Like most Jews, I sat at Seder tables saying Dayenu, and sincerely thanked Hashem for all that he did for us, but my mind also went to all TBS has done for me and I was filled with overwhelming gratitude. Not only did you give me the honor to be your cantor, but you helped me relocate, allowed me to do new programming with your youth, welcomed my family and Marisa when they have come to visit, planned a beautiful installation, and so much more.

Now onto my thoughts ahead of Shavuot. If you're not familiar with the story of the 1978 masterpiece "Rocky," it's definitely one worth watching. It's the story of a young boxer down on his luck, on the verge of giving up his entire career to do loan shark intimidation. However, at the last moment, he's given an opportunity by one of the biggest promoters in the world to fight the reigning heavyweight champion and gets his title shot. He takes complete advantage of it, too. He works incredibly hard with his trainer, and after an epic training montage, he fights the world champion, and makes it all 15 rounds against him. Thus starting a series of films that will forever be iconic. In a very similar vein, like Rocky, we were at our lowest point as slaves in the land of Egypt, and God saved us with an outstretched arm and gave us our shot at being the "Chosen People," and even though at times we've faltered, the Mana complaint and the golden calf amongst others throughout time, we always remember the covenant we made with God on Mt Sinai and the commitment to our faith. Shavuot is the time when we come together to remember that covenant by coming together, eating dairy, and studying Torah.

According to Shulchan Aruch Orach Chayim 494, "We have the custom to spread out plants on Shavuot in the synagogue and in houses, as a memory for the happiness of the receiving of the Torah." We have a custom everywhere to eat dairy food on the first day of Shavuot.

It seems as if the text is telling us that we need to be as joyous as possible, which makes sense given that this is when we received what is arguably the most important text in our tradition. Much like the underdog that went the distance in Philadelphia in 1978, we should make sure that there is as much joy as possible as we celebrate Shavuot, the time of the giving of our Torah. Chag Sameach, and may your Shavuot be a joyous one.

We continue to plan our programs and events for 2025-2026 and look forward to another year of exciting, educational, and engaging programs. We are thinking a little outside the box for this coming year. Our yearly activities, which include Annual Membership Brunch, Sisterhood Shabbat, and Sisterhood sponsored Library Book Review have been put on the calendar. As a replica of a food basket a Bimah Basket symbolizes the gift of food to the hungry and needy

As a major part of our social action programs, TBS Sisterhood's Bimah Basket program raises funds to benefit organizations that primarily feed the hungry and needy. When we began this project both All Faith's

Food Bank and JFCS had projects that focused on feeding the poor. Recently we learned that JFCS no longer sponsors a Kosher Food Bank. After much research and discussion the TBS Sisterhood Board of Directors voted to designate All Faith's Food Bank and Meals on Wheels Sarasota as the recipients of 60% (30% each) of the Bimah Baskets proceeds. At the end of this fiscal year funds will be dispersed to both *All Faith's Food Bank* and *JFCS* as we have done for the past several years.

Beginning on June 1, 2025, the recipients of Bimah Basket proceeds will be All Faith's Food Bank and Meals on Wheels Sarasota.

IDELSON LIBRARY NEWS

LIBRARY HOURS

The Main Library (near the Sanctuary) and the Library Alcove (near the Social Hall) are open whenever the synagogue is open for your browsing or borrowing pleasure! (The Main Library may be unavailable if there is a class or meeting.) Please use the self-checkout system to take out material (be sure to write your name and phone number legibly on the card). All the DVDs, large print books, and the newest books are in the Alcove. In the Main Library, there are also interesting books which are arranged by Fiction (in order by author), Biography (in order by subject), and Nonfiction topics such as Bible, Holidays, History, and Israel - see the labels on the top of each bookshelf. Nonfiction books are arranged by the Weine Classification System for Judaica Libraries (similar to the Dewey Decimal system). On top of the bookshelf near the back door of the Main Library, there is a black binder that contains a detailed list of the Weine System sections and a relative index.

Please remember to return all items in the Book Return Cart near the Main Library. If you need help finding a book or DVD, or wish the library to purchase a particular book or DVD, please feel free to contact me.
