RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom Temple Beth Sholom haverim,

As you receive this month's edition of the Messenger, we will be beginning our observance of Passover, the world's oldest, and perhaps most significant, religious celebration.

The theme of Passover is timeless, eternal and that is while the meaning of Pesach has particular Jewish historical messages about the origins of the people of Israel, it nevertheless also contains messages that are universal: freedom, hope, the fight against oppression and the wonder of the prevailing heroism of the weak struggling against evil in the world.

As a child, Seders with my family in Los Angeles, were filled with wonderful memories of home-made gefilte fish (straight from the shtetl in Skvira!), catching up on family news, feeling proud of retelling the narrative of our Jewish people's beginnings with all the drama (duly led most years by my blessed father, Leo, z'l) of history that felt as if were taking place today.

One of the passages, actually two, in the Haggadah, that I had a particularly difficult time relating to, were these: B'chol dor va'dor—In every generation there would arise a nation/people that was determined to wipe the Jewish people off the map; God arose and the enemy was ultimately defeated, and, shfoch hamatch, before opening the door for Elijah to enter our home, was the instruction that we are to, as God, spill the blood of reflecting God's anger at these numerous enemies of Israel throughout history.

Now, as an adult, sadly, these admonitions make much clearer sense. Soon after my own birth, which was preceded by the events that led my grandparents to come to America, the awful surge of antisemitism from 1881–1921 (the end of the Russian Civil War), that saw the deaths of thousands of Jews in the Pale of Settlement, through pogroms, rape, murder and diabolical hatred of the Jews in the "old country".

And soon after those events, we had to absorb the awful reality of the Shoah, the murder of more than 1/3 of our people.

What is the enemy today? Clearly with the center of Jewish life moving toward our Jewish state of Israel, it has been Iran, Islamic extremism and the celebration of terror and violence that has cost so many lives and threats to Israel's very existence. I only pray that when you receive this message that the war against Iran will be over and we can thank the bravery

of our US Armed Forces and Israel Defense Forces who have been called upon to bring security to the world that we know here in the lands of freedom.

I suppose the Haggadah wants us to remember the ongoing struggle against evil, from Pharaoh, to Nebuchadnezzar, to Haman, to Rome, to medieval Christendom and Islam, to Hitler, Stalin and more throughout history in order to remind us that we have a duty to continue to bring God's Order and goodness, and shalom, to the rest of the world. That peace cannot be victorious over the antithesis to God, without our commitment to the Mitzvot and our Jewish heritage, which we celebrate at Passover.

Dayenu! We sing in order to understand once again how fortunate we are to be living as Jews and with the values that have long endured the forces of evil and anti-God.

Shfoch hamatcha—yes, we do hope that those who attempt to murder us and others, who terrorize the innocent, will find their days coming to an end speedily and soon, in order for good to prevail once and for all time.

The ultimate beauty of Passover is while we recount the evil of our people's bondage in Mitzrayim/Egypt, we also know that we travel in the Haggadah from ganai (degradation) to shevach (praise)...from death to life, from plagues to liberation, from the Sinai desert to Jerusalem, as we finish with the words, "Next Year in Jerusalem!"

I wish all of you a sweet and delicious Pesach...plenty of matzah brei, matzah with cream cheese, herring, gefilte fish, kosher wine from Israel, and time with our beloved family.

Have a Pesach Kasher v'Sameach!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Rabbi Jack Dermer and his family left a positive impression on the congregation. Following Rabbi Dermer's visit, the opinions of the congregational survey, the Search Committee, and the Board were all positive. The Search Committee and Board both voted to begin discussions of terms with Rabbi Dermer. A subcommittee of the Finance Committee has reached an agreement of terms with Rabbi Dermer. These will become part of the final contract for Board approval prior to the vote of the congregation. This will be discussed at the congregational meeting.

Torah Fund was a great success honoring Evie Mitchell following an inspiring learning session led by Rabbi Mimi Weizel. Rabbi Weizel spoke of the importance of Shalom in our services and our lives. And Evie currently does, and has done, so much for our congregation, as well as their congregation before us. She truly is a Light of Torah.

It will be difficult to top March. But it all starts on April 1st with our community Seder. We've already exceeded last year's reservations with over one hundred coming as of this writing.

After Passover, we'll have a film matinee showing of Nathan-ism on the 15th, the Cantor's music classes on the 16th and 23rd, and the Cantor's shmooze on the 17th and 30th.

We'll be kicking off our Centennial Year celebration with our first event on the afternoon of April 19. We're bringing back some of our senior members for an enlightening panel discussion and question and answer session led by Eric Faerber, as well as some good food prepared by Felicia Servetz and her crew. Come learn about some of the history of our wonderful congregation!

All of these events are intermingled with our regular events that occur most weeks, like Mah Jongg on most Tuesday afternoons, Rabbi Altshuler's classes From the Shoah to the rebirth of Israel on most Wednesday mornings, and Hebrew classes. And don't forget our daily minyan at 8:00 AM. Check the calendar to see if it's live or on Zoom.

Our Shabbat services are another opportunity to bring peace into our lives. A chance to gather together in peace, Shalom, to sing together and socialize with our Temple Family. THIS is what Shabbat is about! It's our chance to set aside all the news of the day as we step inside our Jewish home to be together, to pray together, and to set aside our differences for social time.

CANTOR'S MESSAGE

Shalom Chaverim,

As we head into the month of April, I can't help but think of our snowbirds who will soon be leaving us. There is a fabulous ruach that comes about when we are all together! It never feels like we have had enough time together before they head back up north. But as that bit of sadness hits me, and I am reminded of a sweet saying by Winnie the Pooh (I know kind of crazy to be quoting Winnie the Pooh) "How lucky I am to have something that makes saying Goodbye so hard."

The English lexicon has many different ways of saying farewell without actually saying goodbye. A few examples include "see you later", "until next time", and my personal favorite, "don't be a stranger." All of these sayings have one thing in common, none of them have the words goodbye or farewell. I don't find it so surprising since goodbyes are hard to say, especially when it is for a prolonged period.

Luckily for us, the Jewish tradition has plenty of ways of tackling this exact emotion. Our most common way of doing so is saying Tefilat Haderech, The Traveler's Prayer. People who go on extended trips will say this to ask God to watch over them as they journey away from home (typically for a period longer than a month).

"May it be Your will, Gd, our Gd and the Gd of our fathers, that You should lead us in peace and direct our steps in peace, and guide us in peace, and support us in peace, and cause us to reach our destination in life, joy, and peace Blessed are You Gd, who hearkens to prayer."

My favorite version of this sendoff is Debbie Friedman's musical rendition of this prayer. Debbie Friedman's music always seems to capture the levity of any situation, and her interpretation of this prayer is no different.

May we be blessed as we go on our way
May we be guided in peace
May we be blessed with health and joy
May this our blessing, amen.
May we be sheltered by wings of peace
May we be kept in safety and in love
May grace and compassion find their way to every heart
May this be our blessing, amen.
Amen, may this be our blessing, amen

So as we turn our calendar to April, and prepare for our snowbird friends to head back north once again, I pray that everyone is reminded that TBS is a safe space for all who wish to enter its doors. in the Alcove

The Cost of Free Land: Jews, Lakota, and an American Inheritance by Rebecca Clarren, 2023 – a powerful look at the intertwined histories of the author's Jewish ancestors, who homesteaded on the South Dakota prairie in the early 1900s, and the Lakota people from whom the land was taken. The book melds investigative reporting with personal family stories to reveal the true cost of the settlement of the American west.

Zionism: the Sequel, edited by Carol Diamant, 1998 – a smart, thought-provoking anthology of the key thinkers on Israel and Jewish peoplehood. The essays in the book explore the relationship between and among American and Israeli Jews on critical issues, such as the past, present, and future role of Israel in our lives.

Remembrance and Legacy: Profiles of Jewish Sacrifice, Survival, and Strength by Marilyn Cohen Shapiro, 2026 – a collection of poignant essays documenting Holocaust survivors' stories, partisan fighters, and personal testimonies of resilience. The book honors the courage of victims and survivors, highlighting stories of survival, memory, and the lasting impact of the Holocaust on families across generations.

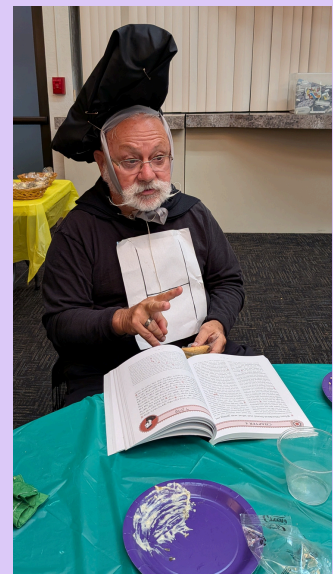

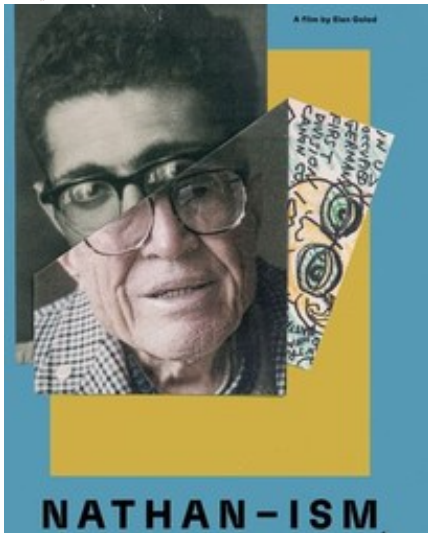


NATHAN-ISM

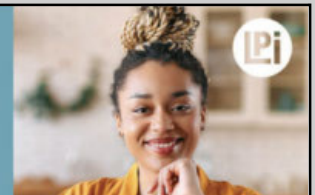

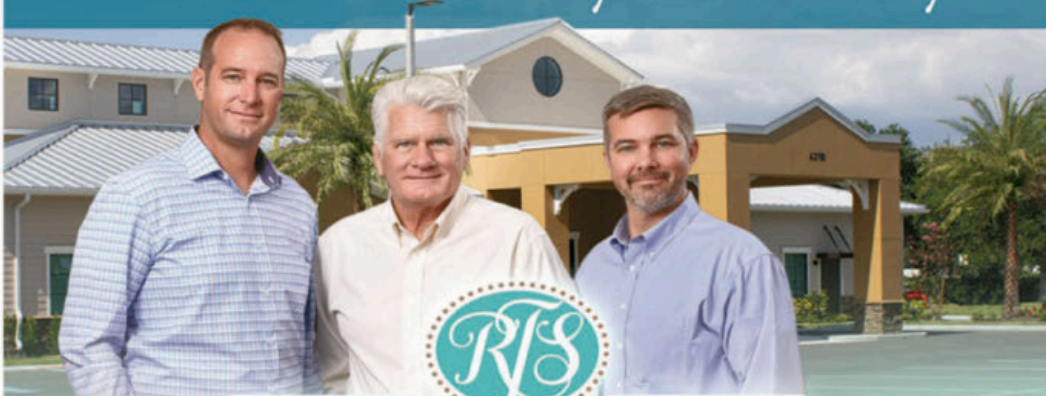

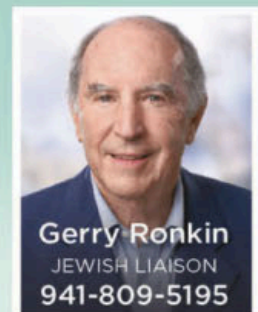
