PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Haverim!

We're entering the depths of Summer. Hurricane season begins! We all pray that we'll be lucky enough to once again escape any hurricanes on the Gulf Coast of Florida. That said, we do need SOME rain! I think we'd like a little more than the dew mentioned in the Amidah at this time of year.

May was an interesting transitional month. We had our Annual Congregational Meeting at which you, the Congregation, voted overwhelmingly to hire Rabbi Dermer as our next spiritual leader. As of this writing we are still not sure of when he'll be able to join us, but no later than January 1, 2027. In the meantime, we're preparing to sign a contract with Rabbi Eytan Kenter for the High Holy Days. We also celebrated Lag B'Omer and Shavuot in May. Our Ritual Committee was very busy lining up leaders for the different segments of the evening Shavuot learning sessions. They've been quite well done and interesting.

In June, things start to quiet down for the summer. On Friday evenings, Kabbalat Shabbat services will be held on Zoom starting June 12th. Saturday mornings, Shabbat services will be held in the Chapel. Rabbi Altshuler will celebrate his service to Temple Beth Sholom on Saturday, June 6, when he will conduct the entire service and read all Torah portions and the Haftarah. TBS is sponsoring the Kiddush in honor of his service to TBS that day. He will then begin his vacation through the rest of the month.

We could see work begin in June to separate Building One's utilities from Building Two's. We're awaiting a proposal for the downsized chiller that will allow us to disconnect the chilled water from Building One. Hopefully, the water disconnection will not present any major problems. In addition, drinking water and sewer will be disconnected before demolition.

Building Three services will be disconnected later in the summer after The Achievement Center vacates the building. This mainly involves the fire sprinkler water, drinking water, and waste lines.

We have to figure out how to pay for the move of the Holocaust Orchard. Our wonderful staff has developed an inventory of the trees and a less expensive way to move trees to the new location on the North side by Lyle St. Plus, we will be relocating the dedication bricks that were laid at Buildings One and Three so they border the walkway through the orchard when it's relocated. The landscape architect is working on a layout and irrigation plan so it will thrive.

I wish you a peaceful, relaxing summer.

CANTOR'S MESSAGE

Shalom Chaverim,

I have been thinking about music a lot lately, which I assume is not surprising since it is a central part of my job. For me, music has the power to connect an actual sound to emotions and memories in such a way that always surprises me. Sometimes hearing a few notes will automatically make me laugh or cry, almost like a Pavlovian response.

Music seems to have an extended reach even beyond an exact set of notes. Have you ever noticed when we hear music that calls to us, we can hear it in everything that sounds even remotely similar? I recently rewatched a few scenes from the biopic of Mozart's life, *Amadeus*. There was a scene in which Mozart turns Salieri's fictional piece, *March of Welcome* (written specifically for this movie), into what we know as the baritone aria, *Non Piu Andrai*, from *The Marriage of Figaro*. I noticed that I was singing the famous aria, which I already knew, completely ignoring Salieri's version (unintentionally). I know this may risk sounding a bit nerdy with my classical music deep dive, but the same hold holds true with all art. For each of us, certain types of art connects with our souls and make their mark.

From speaking with others, whose passions for art may not be music, but instead painting, acting, or dance, I've come to realize that all forms of art have a way of imprinting on our minds and our souls. Art has a way of making us see the world differently and take an introspective look at ourselves.

Today I share my belief that the same can be said with liturgy. It gives us the opportunity to look inwards, as well as appreciate our surroundings. One of the best examples is David Hamelech.

King David is the attributed author of a good portion of the 150 psalms. His words have been set to melodies over the centuries and are timeless. Their power lies in the way these words inspire us, and for me, combining this beautiful liturgy with music only makes it more powerful.

For example; take these words from Psalm 27, the psalm for the season of repentance:

אַחַת | שְׁאַלְתִּי מֵאֵת־יְהוָה אוֹתָהּ אֶבְקֶשׁ שְׁבֹתִי בְּבֵית־יְהוָה כָּל־
יְמֵי חַיִּי לַחַזֹּנוֹת־בְּנֵעַם־יְהוָה וּלְבַקֵּר בְּהִיכְלוֹ:

“One thing I ask of GOD, only that do I seek: to live in GOD's house all the days of my life, to gaze upon GOD's beauty, to frequent the temple.”

There is a traditional melody that accompanies Psalm 27 set in a minor key that captures the feeling of repentance. On the opposite side of the spectrum is Chava Mirel's version, which is set in major and offers a sense of comfort and return. Two separate melodies, but the words remain the same. King David's words are used as a canvas for us to find inspiration. That is the true beauty of all art, especially liturgical art, which has the capability to do.

I pray that this summer we allow ourselves to be inspired by beautiful art in all its forms. Whether it be a beautiful painting, song, prayer, or even a beautiful tree in a yard, I pray that we are able to derive meaning from whatever we happen to gaze upon. May we appreciate the object in its intended state, and then make it our own. May we gain joy from being able to experience the wonder that is art, and may we be inspired to create our own.

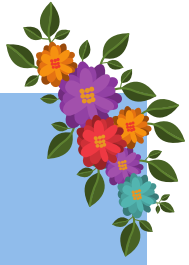

My Life in a nutshell

David was born on June 15, 1925, in the Bronx, New York. His mother was from Russia, and his father was from London. They met in New York when she was 21 years old. His family was the only Jewish family in the neighborhood when his parents moved there. He lived in the Bronx for the first 50 years of his life. David was drafted into the Navy at the age of 18. He experienced D-Day and Hiroshima. He married his first wife, Miriam “Mickey” Wagner, and they had 3 sons. David worked as a detective in New York. He then moved on to the police department’s Medical Bureau. He served there for 20 years and retired as an Administrator of Radiology. David and his wife moved to Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, due to an illness she was suffering from. David started a standalone radiology center with 2 partners. He eventually sold the business and model to an investor from California. David remarried Anne Marie after his first wife passed away. She converted to Judaism and had her Mikvah on the shores of Florida. He loved to travel, with Italy as his favorite destination. David is a longstanding member of Temple Beth Sholom.

David will be **celebrating his 101st birthday** this year.

As a replica of a food basket, a Bimah Basket symbolizes the gift of food to the hungry and needy.

As a major part of our social action programs, TBS Sisterhood's Bimah Basket program raises funds to benefit organizations that primarily feed the hungry and needy. The TBS Sisterhood Board of Directors voted to designate All Faiths' Food Bank and Meals on Wheels Sarasota as the recipients of 60% (30% each) of the Bimah Baskets proceeds. Funds will be dispersed to both All Faiths Food Bank and Meals on Wheels Sarasota. Twice during a fiscal year.

NEWS for the 2025 – 2026 fiscal year

TBS SISTERHOOD GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE

Ingredients:

- 32 oz frozen green beans
- 10 oz cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 1/2 cup of mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1/2 cup grated cheese
- 1 cup crushed cheese crackers

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
2. Cook green beans according to package directions and drain.
3. Pour the beans into a 9"x 13" disposable aluminum pan.
4. Spoon a mixture of the soup, mayonnaise, olive oil, lemon juice, and cheese over the beans. Top with crushed crackers.
5. Bake the covered pan for 20-25 minutes.
6. Cool, cover with foil, and freeze.

Variations: Add cooked carrots, corn, beans, broccoli, mushrooms, fried onions, pasta, or slivered nuts.
Adjust the wet mixture as needed.

Put your last name on masking tape on the foil.

Bring to the Temple the week of delivery and place in the TBS walk-in freezer. Ask staff for help!

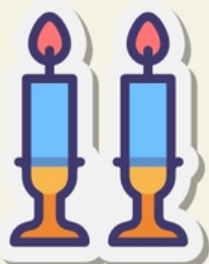

Ruth Bader Ginsburg – “I Dissent”

Ruth Bader Ginsburg was an American lawyer and jurist who served as an associate justice of the Supreme Court of the United States from 1993 until her death in September 2020. She was the second woman and the first Jewish woman ever appointed to the Court and became the longest serving Jewish Justice.

She championed fairness and equality and objected to different expectations for men and women, prejudice against minority groups in places like hotels and restaurants, and women having fewer job opportunities than men. Ruth served on the national board of the ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union) and launched The Women's Rights Project, she continued to be a leading voice for gender equality, women's interests, and civil rights and liberties.
