PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Haverim!

April was a full month, kicking off on the first with our wonderful Temple Beth Sholom Seder! We had a joyful crowd. Rabbi Altshuler and Cantor Taibel did a wonderful job of leading us in an inspiring Seder. The food was delicious and well-served by Michael's on East. It was well attended by over 120 people, including members, non-members, and guests. We always look forward to the TBS Seders. We've received many compliments on the Seder from attendees. In the days following the Seder, our Passover services were well attended.

On the fifteenth, we showed the film "Nathan-ism". Rabbi Mates' presence and discussion enhanced the film's enjoyment and relevance. It's a fascinating story.

Our medical Lunch and Learn series continued with our member, Dr. Les Kreisler, speaking on "Our Three Ears." It was well attended and a very informative discussion. He explained how the inner ear works, what can harm our hearing, and provided information on hearing aids.

As the spring progresses and our seasonal friends depart for the frozen north, our programming slows down a bit as well. We still have a lot happening, and we're starting to plan programming for the coming year in our calendar discussions that started in April.

In May, there are some highlights. Rabbi Altshuler's class on Wednesday mornings continues into May, "From the Shoah to the Rebirth of Israel". Cantor Taibel continues his schmoozing sessions once a month on Thursdays. Marsha and Irving Mason talk about their family. And, of course, we celebrate Shavuot on May 21 - 23.

Also coming up on May 3 is our Annual Meeting. In addition to the presentation of the budget, we will also, pursuant to the bylaws, be requesting the congregation to approve the hiring of Rabbi Jack Dermer. Based upon the survey results following his interview visit in which 98% of respondents answered yes, we're hoping for a good turnout of support and that it will be reflected in the vote. Please come out for this important meeting, in person and on Zoom.

I'll have more on this in June but May spells the end of the leases in Building One. Our two tenants, An Apple A Day, who's been with us for several years, and the Sarasota Jewish Day School, who have been with us for this one year, will be moving on to more permanent homes. We wish them well as they move forward.

Following their departure, we will be preparing for the demolition of Building One for our future addition to the parking lot when Gilbane takes over the southern part of our campus. We have an engineering company preparing drawings and specifications for contracts to relocate or disconnect utilities from Building One: drinking water and sanitary sewer, chilled water supply and return, and the electric that feeds the kitchen and chiller from Building One.

CANTOR'S MESSAGE

Summer has once again rolled around, and it always feels like a good time to try new things. When I first came to Sarasota, I was very much an avid golfer. I would play once a week for about eight months. However, when fall rolled around, I stopped playing my weekly round of golf. For a while, I kept sitting at home, debating whether to play golf. Then, a funny thing happened a week prior to me writing this article. I went out and played a round of golf. I did okay, but that didn't matter because at the end of the day, it was nice to play and get back out on the course. When I played, it felt like I was enjoying myself in a way that I hadn't been in a while.

There's a line in one of my favorite TV shows of all time, *Scrubs*, that reminds me of this feeling. The main character is dealing with an elderly patient who refuses treatment and wishes to pass comfortably. As he tries to convince her to get treatment and continue living, she notices that he is fixated on her, and she asks him, "When's the last time you sat on the grass and done nothing?" That line really struck me because, as much as we would like to focus on ourselves, it can be hard to do so. Even with the best intentions to slow down, we can fall by the wayside due to the nature of our daily lives.

Our faith has a concept that allows us that great pleasure, Shabbat. The beautiful thing about Shabbat is that it comes every week. The opportunity for rest and renewal always comes on Friday and Saturday without fail. I grew up in a congregation where the term 'Renewal' was always associated with Shabbat; it wasn't until I started Cantorial School that I realized why. To quote the definition of Renewal as told by Sefaria.org, "Renewal is a concept that can involve revitalizing, reinvigorating, or returning to an original state."

Perhaps that original state can refer to returning to synagogue, reconnecting with an old friend, or even just taking up an old hobby. There are endless ways to experience renewal.

Perhaps the opportunity for renewal comes with our daily choices. My hope and prayer for all of us is that we may find the moments that make us realize how amazing it is to be alive this summer and beyond. May we be able to allow ourselves the opportunity to experience renewal in any form, and may we have the courage to embrace that renewal with open arms.

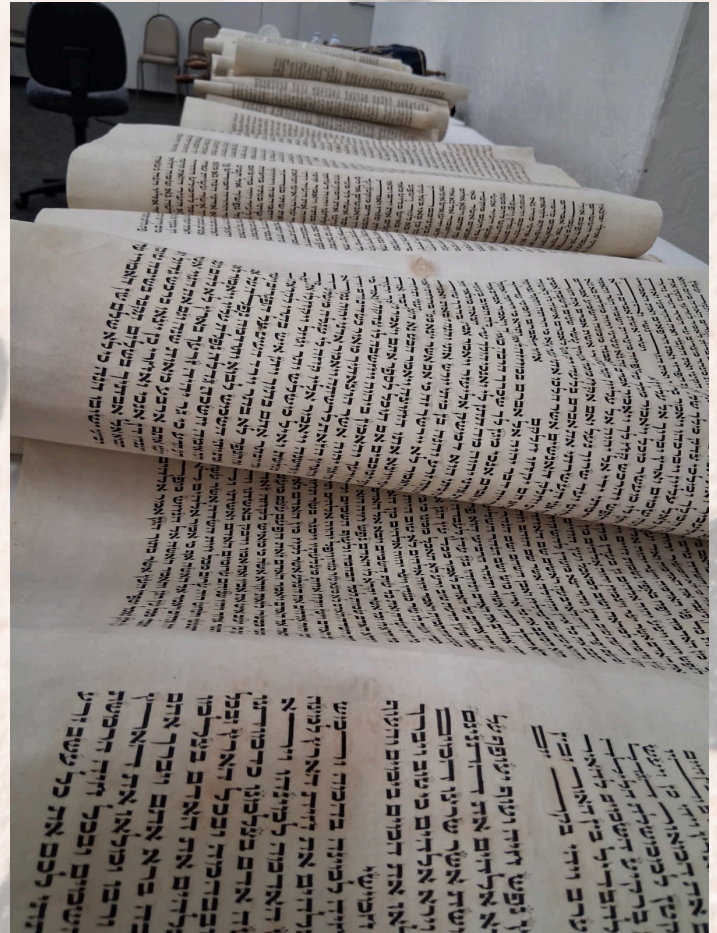

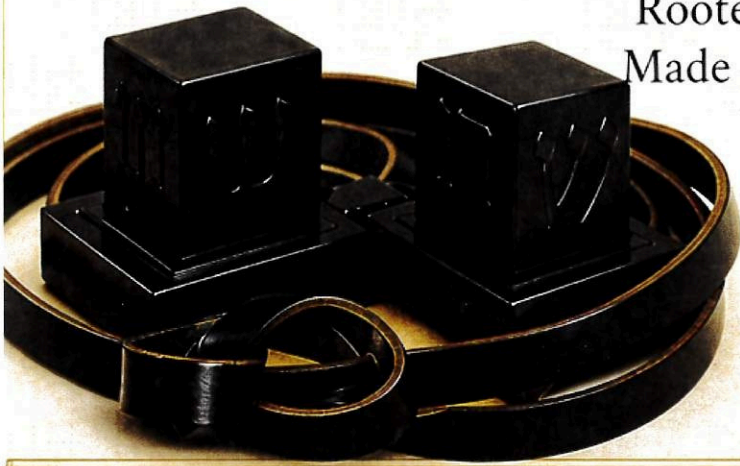
