**NITZAVIM-VAYEILECH** contains the crucial speech that Moses delivers on the very last day of his life. & he is feeling a sense of urgency. As the Israelites stand on the steppes of Moab. preparing to enter the Land of Israel, Moses reminds them it is not only they who are standing there, entering into the covenant, but also all future Jews. He tells them that they stand before God equally, without regard to age, gender & the kind of work they do. Moses reserves a special contempt for those who would turn away from God and the covenant. But Moses also reminds them that those who turn away can always turn back. Unwilling to allow his final words to be filled with anger. Moses encourages the Israelites & helps them understand the covenant is not too difficult to follow, & that the Torah presents them with choices—life or death, blessing or curse. When all is said & done, the Israelites must choose *life*: **Teshuvah** is not only necessary, it is possible. Moses declares he is growing old. & he tells the Israelites that Joshua will be their new leader, & that they will be successful in conquering & entering the land of Canaan. Moses decrees that the entire book of Deuteronomy must be read every seven years during the festival of Sukkot. Moses repeats that the Israelites will be tempted to worship other gods, & as a result they will be punished

for doing so. At that time, they feel that the Divine Presence is hidden but God will still be present. The Israelites are commanded to write down the poem (or song) that Moses is about to deliver to the people, as a future warning about their potential failures to live up to their scared obligations.
