Where has the time gone? The High Holidays and Sukkot are over, our services were beautiful and spiritual, it's November, and the season has already been underway for a few weeks.

If you were at the Temple during the holidays, I hope you had the opportunity to stop in to see the newly refreshed chapel. It is beautiful and will enhance the spiritual experience of all who use it. I would like to thank the committee that worked on the Chapel Project led by Toby Simon and our House and Grounds Chair, Elliott Corn. I would also like to thank TBS member and interior designer, Patty Schimberg, for her dedication to the project.

One more thing about the chapel project – there are a few additional items we would like to do that could not be done within the approved budget, such as new Torah holders, new chairs on the Bimah, refinishing of the Torah reading table and Bimah lecterns, and refinishing of the parquet flooring in the chapel foyer. If anyone would like to donate to accomplish any of these items, please let Toby, Elliott, or me know.

Our programming for the 2019-20 season is already underway. We have published a beautiful brochure containing descriptions of all the programming currently on the calendar. Thank you to our newest staff member, Lex Calaguas, Marketing & Communications Coordinator, for putting this piece together.

I would like to call attention to one of the programs coming up very soon featuring Dr. Kenneth Stein, Professor of Contemporary Middle East History, Political Science, and Israeli Studies at Emory University in Atlanta. Since 2007, Professor Stein's Center for Israel Education has trained over 2.500 Jewish teachers how to teach about Israel and has impacted over 400,000 Jewish young people in North America, Professor Stein will speak four times from Shabbat evening on November 8 through Sunday breakfast on November 10. Details on the topics of each speech are in the Program Booklet and on the TBS website.

Edith and I have known Dr. Stein for 15 years since we sponsored his attendance as a scholar at Fairfield University in Connecticut. I guarantee that you will come away from this wonderful weekend with new insights into Israel, the Middle East, anti-Semitism and BDS on university campuses in the United States. Dr. Stein's visit to TBS is being underwritten by Larry and Debbie Haspel.

There are so many other great programs coming up after the Stein lectures that I hesitate to try to mention them all here. Please consult the Program Brochure for dates and times of these fascinating events.

Switching gears to fund raising, I am pleased to report that we have achieved our goal for this year's Kol Nidre appeal. However, less than 50 percent of the congregation has made a gift as of this date. On Kol Nidre night, in my address to the congregation, I said that if we made the goal, I would propose to the board that contributions received after October 9 would be used for two capital projects — repaying the parking lots and more security for our building. The board has approved my proposal, and we are already depositing recently received gifts in a fund for those projects. If you have already given, THANK YOU. If you have not yet made your 2019 Kol Nidre gift, please do so now. Let's see if our community can demonstrate solidarity and achieve 100 percent participation in the campaign.

Finally, an update on the Cantor Azi Schwartz Concert at the Sarasota Opera House on January 12, 2020. The Opera House is SOLD OUT. This TBS project has received overwhelming support from our TBS community and the wider Sarasota community. Thank You to Ros Mazur and the Mazur family for conceiving of this program and underwriting it financially in memory of Len Mazur. Thank You to our Concert Committee Co-Chairs: Saranee Newman, Fran Cohen and Edie Chaifetz. Thank You to our Sponsors and all who have bought tickets for your support.

LIFE & LEGACY SPOTLIGHT

Esme and Eric Faerber



It didn't take long for Esme and Eric Faerber to become fully involved at Temple Beth Sholom. They moved to Sarasota in 2016, after visiting a friend and fell in love with the area, weather and especially the local arts and cultural offerings. Originally from Johannesburg, South Africa, they spent 30 years in Philadelphia where they both had distinguished careers before moving to Florida.

Esme was the first female to obtain an MBA from the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg. She also is a CPA and was a professor and department chair of Business and Accounting at several colleges. She is the author of numerous books on investments, stocks and bonds. Her books have been translated into Chinese and Arabic. As a teen in South Africa, she was a junior tennis champion and won a gold medal at the Maccabi Games in Tel Aviv. She went on to become an accomplished professional athlete. She was the Junior French Open tennis champion, reached the quarterfinals of women's doubles and mixed doubles at Wimbledon, and was a doubles semi finalist at the French Open. She also represented South Africa in the Federation Cup and was part of the Virginia Slims tennis circuit with Billie Jean King.

Eric went to medical school at the University of Witwatersrand and served as senior radiologist at Baragwanath Hospital in Soweto (currently the third largest hospital in the world). He specialized in pediatric radiology and neuroradiology in Boston and subsequently served as Department director of radiology and President of the medical staff at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, in Philadelphia. He was a past president of the Pennsylvania Radiologic Society and is currently president of one of the national pediatric radiology societies. He has received many honors and awards over the course of his medical career, and has been inducted into the national AOA Honor Medical Society. He is also an author and editor of numerous books on pediatric radiology.

Eric and Esme grew up with traditional Jewish backgrounds. Esme's grandparents were of Lithuanian and Sephardic background. Eric's grandparents were originally from Latvia and Lithuania. Both their parents were born in South Africa. Eric's grandfather, who had been vice-president of his congregation, instilled in Eric a deep sense of Jewish values. Both went to Hebrew School, had strong Jewish identities and were regularly observant growing up in South Africa. While in Philadelphia they belonged to a Conservative Congregation so it was only natural that they would check out TBS when they arrived in Sarasota. They were immediately engaged and appreciated the warm reception they received at TBS. When asked about their TBS experience, they said: "We found the prayers, rituals, and melodies very similar to what we experienced in South Africa. Being part of TBS has contributed significantly to our Jewish experience and identity."

Esme and Eric are doers. Soon after becoming members they "got involved". Esme serves on the TBS Finance Committee, co-chaired the TBS Sisterhood Program Committee and is currently Treasurer of Sisterhood. Eric is the TBS Program chair and Historian. He is a board member of the Men's Club. He has been on the TBS board of directors for the past two years and currently serves as Vice President. When asked why they have committed to participate in the TBS Life and Legacy Program, they said: "We live in a global and domestic environment that is increasingly anti-Semitic. Maintaining TBS as a Conservative Synagogue for years to come is not only important to us but is also important for future generations. Being part of the Life and Legacy Program is part of our way of expressing our Jewish identity and concern for Jewish life."







Martin Buber: A Life of Faith and Dissent Reviewed by Harold Halpern





Brundibar is a translated Czech opera composed in 1938 by Jewish composer Hans Krasa with a libretto by Adolph Hoffemister and has an added prologue that speaks of HOPE and OPTIMISM for the future. Shabbat Shmooze: An Interview with Sonia Fuentes November 16

Sonia Pressman Fuentes was born in Berlin, Germany, and came to the U.S. with her family, after nine months in Antwerp, Belgium, on May 1, 1934, to escape the Holocaust. She grew up in the Catskill Mountains of NY State and graduated as valedictorian from Monticello (NY) High School. She is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Cornell University and a summa cum laude graduate of the University of Miami (Florida) School of Law

She has been involved in women's rights since 1963, when she testified in Congress in favor of the passage of the Equal Pay bill on behalf of the ACLU. In 1965, she joined the General Counsel's office of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) as its first female attorney. She drafted one of the EEOC's earliest *Digests of Legal Interpretations*, its first guidelines on pregnancy and childbirth, and the EEOC's decision finding that airlines violated the law when they terminated or grounded stewardesses due to marriage or reaching the age of 32 or 35.

In November 1996, at a ceremony honoring the founders of NOW, Betty Friedan presented her with the Veteran Feminists of America Medal of Honor. On October 10, 1999, she was one of four recipients of the 1999 Women at Work Award of Wider Opportunities for Women given in recognition of her commitment to women's issues and leadership in the fields of law and business. Prior recipients included Jane Fonda, Katie Couric, Linda Ellerbe, and Hillary Rodham Clinton.

Ms. Fuentes lives in Sarasota, FL, where she is a feminist, activist, a writer, and a public speaker. She is the author of a memoir, Eat First--You Don't Know What They'll Give You, The Adventures of an Immigrant Family and Their Feminist Daughter. Ms. Fuentes will be interviewed by Barbara Sander, a leader of National Brandeis and an accomplished presenter. This is a schmooze that you will not want to miss!
