## RABBI'S MESSAGE



For the third month in a row, I sit down to write my *Messenger* article with thoughts of the High Holidays coming ahead. Since I have focused on preparations for the holidays and some holiday-specific rituals, I thought I would jump past Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and look at Sukkot. It always seems to happen that while much time and energy is spent preparing for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, Sukkot always seems to sneak up and surprise us. Sukkot follows just four days after Yom Kippur and most of the time, one of those days is Shabbat. In that time the sukkah has to be put up and decorated and the holiday services and meals need to be prepared. Rest assured, we are keeping it in our sights but I almost always enter it feeling unprepared.

Maybe this is part of the power of Sukkot. Symbolism of the sukkah includes the idea of being unprepared. We leave the comfort of our strong and stable homes and head outside under the impermanent roof of the sukkah. While that's how the roof is supposed to be, we could have in the back of our minds, "If I were just a bit more prepared, I would have finished this roof and felt more secure." It makes me think of the Little Pig who makes a house out of sticks. It is strong enough to give the illusion of safety but still leaves the pig vulnerable.

Here is the message of Sukkot. No matter how prepared we are, we are always a bit vulnerable. There are always things we try to mitigate against but things happen. We leave the house with plenty of time to get somewhere but an accident on I-75 keeps us from getting there on time. We buy enough eggs for the week but a couple roll off the counter and we end up short. We should never be certain that things will work out 100% as planned.

So, we prepare for Sukkot. We have time scheduled Sunday morning, October 13, to put up the sukkah at Beth Sholom. Come and join us at 9:00 am to build or at 10:30 am to put up decorations. Sign up for Sippin' in the Sukkah with Sisterhood on October 17 and for the Sukkot Shabbat Dinner on October 18. And come dance with the Torahs on Simchat Torah, the evening of October 21. Of course, there are morning services for all the days of Sukkot as well.

Along with these preparations, also prepare yourself mentally to be able to handle the unexpected, the vulnerabilities that we don't see coming. Learn from the sukkah that you don't know what you don't know and you will be able to face the unknown with strength and fortitude.

This year, Edith and I took a driving vacation to the Pacific Northwest. We drove from San Jose, California to the Portland, Oregon area. We were awestruck by the beautiful scenery as we drove along the Pacific coastline and through the magnificent redwood forests of that area. When we arrived in Astoria, Oregon, at the mouth of the beautiful Columbia River, it was Friday afternoon and I Googled to see if there were any synagogues where we might attend Friday evening services in that city of about 10,000 people. The answer that I received was that the nearest synagogues were between 60 and 110 miles from Astoria, in and around Portland. Isn't it true that regardless of how far and wide we travel, it's always great to be home and have your choice of where you live validated.

We are now in the midst of High Holiday season, and for the next several weeks TBS will be a beehive of activity. Our planning, which began months ago, will result, we hope, in a spiritual and peaceful experience.

I look forward to seeing you during this busy time. Please give me some feedback during this period on your High Holiday experiences at TBS. During the remainder of the year, I would also like to hear from you about how TBS has been doing in meeting the expectations you have for your religious home. Our synagogue leadership is continuously striving to improve the congregation's performance so we need your input.

In earlier articles, I have emphasized the importance to TBS of building our membership. In the month of August, we added seven new member units. With all of the growth in this part of Florida, I am sure there are many potential members in the community. Please help us by bringing their names to the attention of our new membership chairs, Carol Shatoff and Adele Tannenbaum. #### **TORAH FUND**

"The Torah begins and ends with kindness:
God clothing Adam and Eve, and burying Moses." [Gen. 3:21, Deut. 34.6]
Talmud, Sotah 14a.

This year's Torah Fund pin, *Hesed*, evokes thoughts of examples of Jewish acts of kindness, done without expectation of reward. Many Bible teachings come to mind: Abraham and Sarah welcoming strangers to their tent in the heat of the day; Abraham's servant's prayer for a wife for Isaac, answered by Rebecca who offers water to him and to his camels; and Ruth, who shows loyalty and kindness to Naomi, adopting her religion and peoplehood after Naomi has experienced great loss. 

November 6, 2019 – Jane Greenfield will review Witness: Letters From Elie Wiesel's Classroom by Ariel Burger, 2018 – In this profoundly hopeful, thought-provoking, and inspiring book, Burger takes us into Elie Wiesel's classroom, where the art of listening and storytelling conspires to keep memory alive. As Wiesel's teaching assistant, Burger gives us a front-row seat witnessing these remarkable exchanges in and out of the classroom. The act of listening, of sharing these stories makes of us, the readers, witnesses. Sponsored by the Idelson Library and Sisterhood in honor of Jewish Book Month.

December 4, 2019 – Harold Halpern will review Martin Buber: A Life of Faith and Dissent by Paul Mendes-Flohr, 2019 – Faith and dissent are the dominant themes in Buber's Jewishness. For Buber being a Jew required faith in God and an obligation to dissent when that faith was distorted. The book explores Buber's faith and dissent in his own words, including his courage in the face of Naziism and his approach to Zionism.

November 21, 2019 - Once In A Lifetime -2014, 105 min, French (English subtitles) – An uplifting, fact-based story of a dedicated history teacher at a Paris high school who decides to challenge her apathetic, ethnically-diverse students with a unique assignment – a national competition on the theme of child victims of the Nazi concentration camps. Although the project is initially met with extreme resistance, a faceto-face encounter with a Holocaust survivor changes the students' attitudes dramatically. As they move forward with their project, these once-rebellious teens begin to see one another and themselves – in a new light. This moving film demonstrates the enduring impact of the Holocaust in transforming future generations.



December 19, 2019 – Theodore Bikel: In The Shoes of Sholom Aleichem – 2014, 75 min. – An enchanting and inspiring documentary that weaves together the stories of two beloved Jewish icons: Sholom Aleichem, the great Jewish storyteller, whose prose portrays the true soul of the tragicomic Jewish shtetl; and Theodore Bikel: the legendary actor, singer, troubadour, Jewish activist, and interpreter par excellence of Aleichem's stories. Using vintage film interviews with celebrities, and footage of Bikel performances, this film is filled with laughter, tears, and music.







I wish everyone a Chag Sameach for the holidays that we will share in the coming month.












