RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom Temple Beth Sholom members:

The Holidays are now behind us and there is no more important time than the days after the Hagim, when we can start realizing many of our ambitious plans for the year.



In the short time I have been here at TBS, I have been so impressed with you—your enthusiasm, your desire to learn, your commitment to perpetuating Jewish life, and making our synagogue a beautiful jewel in our collective lives. What a congregation! I am ready to make our synagogue the center of Jewish intellectual, religious and cultural life.

With the help of Al Treidel and the Education Committee, this is a taste of what is ahead of us, and I am certain that I am leaving out other programs and classes:

- 1) Beginning Tuesday, October 5th at 10:00 a.m. THE JEWISH PEOPLE, JUDAISM: OUR BELIEFS, OUR HISTORY AND OUR WAY OF LIFE—Starting with a unit on God, we will also examine every aspect of Jewish life: the Jewish calendar, Holidays, Shabbat, Kashrut, Jewish sacred literature, Jewish Life Cycle, Hebrew reading, Jewish history, Conservative, Orthodox and Reform Judaism, and all the contemporary issues from abortion to the role of women.
- 2) Beginning Wednesday, October 6th at 10:00 a.m. THE MAJOR TURNING POINTS IN JEWISH HISTORY: This class is a favorite of mine and one which I taught at the university level for many years and is the basis of a future book. We will be looking at Jewish history, not in a linear fashion, year by year, but by the major turning-points in Jewish History: Our origins in Mesopotamia and Egypt; Sinai; the Prophets; The Fall of Jerusalem in 586 BCE; the Greco-Roman period and the Maccabean War 168-165 BCE; the origins of Christianity; The Rabbis: from Mishnah to Talmud; the origins of Islam; Jewish life under the Christian and Islamic Empires; the amazing story of Shabbtai Zvi and false messianism; Hasidism; Enlightenment and the Jews; America and the Jews; The rise of 19th-century nationalism and antisemitism; Eastern European Jewry; the Shoah; Zionism and the birth of the State of Israel.

In addition to our classes, we will be continuing TBS' *The Distinguished Speaker Series*, and our line-up now scheduled through February is nothing short of incredible: (All of our speakers will be speaking via Zoom)

- 1) SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 10:00 a.m. AMBASSADOR EITAN NA'EH joined us from Dubai, UAE. Ambassador Naeh is Israel's first ambassador to the Arab Emirates and has been making history bringing the glory of Israel to the Arab world. The Abraham Accords have changed the direction of Israel's future and there is no one able to share with us this incredible development more than Ambassador Naeh.
- 2) WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 13, 1:30 p.m. AUTHOR THOMAS HARDING, author of many bestsellers in the UK, Thomas Harding is a dynamic speaker, and his books have made a significant contribution to our understanding of German Jews in Berlin before WWII (*House by the Lake*) and the amazing story of his uncle Hans Alexander's capture of the Commandant of Auschwitz, Rudoph Hoess.

- 3) WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 1:30 p.m. AMBASSADOR CHRISTOPH WEIDINGER, Austria's Ambassador to Kosovo. Christoph Weidinger has been an influential figure in transforming Austria's contribution to the death of millions of Jews during the Shoah. He is a strong advocate for the Jewish people and has helped influence Austria's relationship with the state of Israel. He is speaking to us on the 83rd anniversary of Kristallnacht, and he will be sharing his reflections on the importance of Austria coming to grips with its history.
- 4) WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 8, 1:30 p.m. PROFESSOR JOHN BARTON, professor emeritus at Oxford University in Bible, the author of numerous books including his latest best-seller, *A History of the Bible* (you can find his book at the local Barnes and Noble and via Amazon). Professor Barton is considered the world's leading scholar in Bible, and he is a true friend of the Jewish people, with a keen sensitivity to Jewish attachment to Scripture. He will be discussing how Christians and Jews look at the same Hebrew Scripture texts differently and why. You won't want to miss this opportunity to be with such a brilliant scholar.
- 5) IN FEBRUARY, date to be determined, PROFESSOR ANTONY POLONSKY, professor emeritus at Brandeis University will be with us via Zoom. Antony Polonsky is the world's leading scholar in Eastern European and Russian Jewish history. His three-volume work on the history of our people in EE and Russia is the definitive account of that history. He is also founder of the Jewish Museum in Warsaw, the author of many books and articles, and my partner for the many trips we planned and did together in Berlin, Warsaw, Vilna, and Prague. Another can't miss!

Speaking of trips, I hope you will all consider joining us for our Central European trip to Budapest, Vienna and Prague scheduled for July 2022. I know there's some legitimate concern about travel abroad because of the pandemic, but we are hoping that by next July we will be resuming our normal lives. And when we do, this trip will be a phenomenal opportunity to learn about our people's history and culture in these three beautiful cities. I have planned many special surprises and guests who will be with us whom you would never be able to meet on all other trips to this part of the world. We have much to do together and I look forward to a year of learning, a year that will touch the lives of many of our beloved congregation.



This program is open at no charge to all Temple Beth Sholom members. Please join us for what promises to be an amazing sports-oriented evening.



Dr. Kalvaria earned his medical degree from the University of Rhodesia in Harare, Zimbabwe. He completed an internship in Internal Medicine and a residency in Gastroenterology at Groote Schuur Hospital, Cape Town, South Africa. He also completed a fellowship in Gastroenterology at the University of Cape Town, South Africa. He is double board-certified in Gastroenterology and Internal Medicine, specializing in all gastrointestinal tract disorders, including the liver and biliary tract.

After moving to the United States in 1986, he served as Assistant Professor of Medicine in Gastroenterology at the University of Florida before joining private practices in Melbourne, FL and then Sarasota, FL. He has held the position of adjunct Professor of Gastroenterology at Florida State University. He has also served as chairman of the Department of Medicine at Sarasota Memorial Hospital and President of the Florida Gastroenterologic Society. Dr. Kalvaria's research interests have included irritable bowel syndrome, inflammatory bowel disorders, acid reflux and fatty liver disease. He has participated in several clinical trials and authored numerous research publications.

After 30 years in private practice, Dr. Kalvaria has retired from active practice. He currently does second opinions by telemedicine and works as a Gastroenterology consultant in the Specialty Community Clinic at Sarasota Memorial Hospital, treating indigent patients with gastrointestinal problems. He has developed an interest in Functional Medicine and recently completed the "Applying Functional Medicine in Clinical Practice" course through the Institute for Functional Medicine. His current interests include public education in disorders of the gastrointestinal system.

German Jews and Germany: Searching for the Truth

Wednesday, October 13
1:30 pm via Zoom

Please join us on Wednesday, October 13 at 1:30 pm for the second installment of The Distinguished Speakers Series with bestselling author Thomas Harding to speak about German Jews and Germany: Searching for the Truth. Among them are Hans and Rudolf: The German Jew and the Hunt for the Kommandant of Auschwitz (2013) that won the JQ-Wingate Prize for Non-Fiction. Harding has written for the Sunday Times, the Washington Post and The Guardian, among other publications. His book The House By The Lake was short-lined for the Costa Biography Award. Other books include Blood On The Page, which won the Crime Writers' Association "Golden Dagger Award for "Non-Fiction," and Future History, which was short-lined for the German Children's Literature Award 2021. His next book White Debt will be published in January 2022. Harding's books have been translated into more than 16 languages.

After Harding's initial presentation, Rabbi Altshuler will join in a dialogue that will touch on various subjects. Harding's great expertise is "Germany: Yesterday and Today." Rabbi Altshuler and Thomas Harding will be exploring the Harding family's Jewish roots, how Jews lived in Berlin before World War II and how they escaped Germany and arrived in London. The story of dismantling, hiding and bringing a sacred Torah Scroll from a Berlin synagogue is a fascinating insight into how the Jews were determined to preserve their Jewish roots and bring them to a new country.

Harding's uncle, Hans Alexander, heroically captured Rudolph Hoess, the Commandant of Auschwitz, and brought him to Nuremburg, where his testimony sealed the doom of his Nazi cohorts. The dialogue will also discuss the history of Germany from the war to today---how has Germany changed and how is the Jewish story there continuing to be written.
