RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom, dear Temple Beth Sholom family,

We are now just a few weeks away from coming together again to usher in Rosh Hashanah, the new year 5783. Our nation, the world, our people, have many challenges that have arisen during the past year: inflation is everywhere and changing the lives of millions, especially in the western world; crime is up significantly in virtually every American city. There has never been any time in which more Americans feel that our nation is going in the wrong direction and the feeling that we are taking many steps backward as a society.



Civility and morality are disappearing, devotion to religious institutions and teachings is sliding away, and there are significant tensions all over the world — with Russia (in Ukraine), with China, with Iran. More and more, people are of the expectation that the worst is yet to come.

That is why our coming together will enable us to find those sparks of hope and optimism that are imbedded in our Jewish ideals and dreams. We know the enormous responsibility God has given our people to lead a troubled world and to recapture and reignite those sources of change and transformation that will set us moving toward a redeemed Jewish people, nation, and world.

Surprisingly, the source of our aspirations to “l’takein olam b’malchut shadai,” to change the world for the kingdom of God (Aleinu) is embedded in the theology of the Yamim Noraim, the heart of which is our concept of “shame.” The English word “shame” comes from the Hebrew, “ashama,” or “guilt/shame offering.” Mark Twain noted that the one characteristic that is unique to human beings and not the animal world is the physiological characteristic we have from “blushing,” which happens out of shame or embarrassment.

The very purpose of the High Holidays is to awaken us to that human characteristic—shame. Not only are we to arouse the guilt that comes from the heightened awareness that our actions might have caused “shame” or “embarrassment” to us because of our sins or missing the mark from what is good and right. We also know that we approach God on Yom Hadin (The Day of Judgment) from the shame stemming from the ills we feel of the world, of America, and yes, in the Jewish world.

This unique gift that only we humans have of shame, or better yet—conscience—means that we are also capable, as created in the image of God, to feel that shame and to begin a process of teshuvah, of repentance.

We know that more and more Jews are staying away from synagogues at the High Holidays, perhaps because feeling shame is not a popular avenue to goodness. To our tradition, without shame, we lose a sense of future, of moral regeneration. Instead, a people separate from the act of contrition and recognition of wrongdoing cannot act in humility to make our lives and of those around us better.

That is the purpose of our coming together this Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur: we will be wrestling with the problems of society, of our souls, of the Jewish people, and hopefully, emerge reawakened and renewed with hope.

As Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel said, “Faith is a blush in the presence of God.”

We will be having another banner year here at TBS, and I'm excited to present a schedule of speakers and guests that will keep us more than busy during these coming months. Please note the beginning of our Tuesday and Wednesday classes, on Philosophy, Turning Points in Modern Jewish History, and some study of the Siddur, the prayerbook.

May 14-23, 2023, our TRIP TO LITHUANIA AND POLAND. This is a do not miss trip with Dr. Antony Polonsky, the pre-eminent scholar of Polish and Russian Jewish history. We already have a number of you ready to sign up. In the coming weeks, we will be pricing the trip and bringing you all the details of our journey that begins in Vilna (Ponar), travels through stops in Lithuania, to Bialystok, to Warsaw, Shabbat dinner with the chief rabbi, Michael Shudrich and the historic Nozyk synagogue, to Lublin, to Krakow and finishing at Birkenau-Auschwitz. We will be limited to 30, so when you get the official announcement, please sign up as soon as possible for your place on the trip.

Our line-up of Distinguished Speakers for 2022-2023 has been set, and please mark your calendars: September 15 – Dr. Jack Wertheimer, former Provost of the Jewish Theological Seminary, my doctoral advisor and friend, author of countless books, and the leading expert and scholar of the American Jewish community and American Judaism. His topic: “The Rival Camps of American Jews—and Why They No Longer Share a Common Language.” For preparation reading: Tablet last month, “Whatever Happened to the Pro-Jewish Left?”

November 11-13, a dual visit: Installation weekend: Rabbi Dr. Joel Rembaum, professor of Medieval Jewish History, and rabbi emeritus of Temple Beth Am, the synagogue where I grew up in Los Angeles. Brilliant teacher and friend. Along with Rabbi Rembaum, Colonel Richard Kemp, Israel's number one military advisor, will be speaking that Sunday morning. He was the UK's military leader of the UK forces in Afghanistan for over ten years. He is another stirring speaker and a champion of the Jewish people and the state of Israel, which he loves.

December 14—Rabbi Dr. Elliot Dorff, author of over 20 books, the chair of the Law Committee of the Conservative Movement, and the intellectual leader of our movement, will be addressing the issue of “Conservative Judaism and Where We Are Today.”

January 18—Dr. John Barton, professor emeritus of Bible at Oxford University, who was with us last year. His new book is due on the shelves in the UK in November, in the United States in the spring, on Bible Translations—how the Hebrew is translated by Jewish and Christian translations and why they make a difference.

February 3-5—To highlight Israel and be in the midst of my charming and brilliant cousin, Dr. Mor Altshuler, who will be coming to us from Karmei Yosef, sharing her academic as well as insights about growing up in Israel and her love of the Land and the nation. Her family, the part of the Altshulers who were avid Zionists, went to Israel in 1883 and was one of the first five families that built the city of Rehovot.

March 15—Melanie Phillips, a prominent journalist from the *Jerusalem Post* and the *Times of London*, and more. She is a fantastic speaker, brilliant intellect, and one of the most widely read journalists in the Jewish world. She'll be joining us from Jerusalem.

April 18—Dr Antony Polonsky, Yom Hashoah. Dr. Polonsky, who will be co-leading our trip to Poland and Lithuania with me, and who was with us last year, will be speaking about Holocaust history, where we will be visiting on our trip, and delighting us with his incredible intellect and soul. Much to look forward to....may you all have a new year filled with hope, health, blessing and peace.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Dear Congregants,

I've been thinking a lot about death and dying these last few months. I know it sounds morbid but in the month of July I lost my mother in law, Betty Haven, who was 82 years old and Rabbi Altshuler lost his mother, Dorothy, who was 101 years old. Both women lived long, vibrant lives and had huge impacts on their families.

Coping with the loss of a loved one may be one of the hardest challenges that many of us face. One thing I learned through this ordeal of burying a loved one is how important it is to look to the future and plan ahead. In the short time between death and burial of a loved one, many family members find themselves rushing to buy a cemetery plot often without a careful thought or a personal visit to the grave site.

TBS owns a cemetery on Circus Blvd. It is the only exclusively Jewish Cemetery in the Sarasota-Manatee area. It was established in 1932 and has ever since served not only our congregation but members of other local congregations, the non-affiliated and even non-Jewish relatives in some circumstances. It sits on 8.4 acres and provides a serene and peaceful final resting place. The cemetery's maintenance, beautification and perpetual care are paid for through the sale of plots.

TBS has a cemetery committee and an office in our building. The volunteers who operate the cemetery have dedicated themselves to serving the congregation and the community with dignity and compassion.

Members of the Committee are: Chair, Ben Berman, Jeff Cohen, Frank Podeitz, Gerry Ronkin, Diane Rudd, Richard Einslen, David Chaifetz, Saul Zatz, Elliott Corn and Merrill Oltchick.

Ben Berman has been the Chair of the Cemetery Committee for the past 12 years. He announced his official retirement at the last meeting and he will be stepping down in December. It's a true loss for TBS. Ben has been the main sales person for burial plots. He coordinates the scheduling of funerals with the funeral homes and answer all questions about the cemetery. He is the keeper of the cemetery map and handles the sales of markers and benches. If that is not enough he meets grieving families at the cemetery to help them with their selections. Ben will be hard to replace, but we need a chair or co-chairs to step up to the plate. We cannot run our cemetery without strong leadership. If you have any interest in taking over the cemetery, Ben is willing to train and mentor someone these next five months. Please consider seriously taking on this role yourself and feel free to contact Ben or me to discuss it. This really is a mitzvah.

REMEMBERING EDWARD KALIN



Remembering Edward “Ed” Kalin

After my wife, Esmé and I joined Temple Beth Sholom as new congregants in mid-2016 I embarked on compiling a history of TBS for the commemorative booklet in honor of the 90th Anniversary Gala to be held in January 2017.

Fortunately, I was advised by some long-standing congregants to call Edward Kalin to get some historic details. He graciously invited me to meet him in his office on Palm Avenue where we spent a very enjoyable afternoon. Ed warmly regaled me, repeatedly with a twinkle in his eye, with his reminiscences of TBS as he knew it.

Edward Lazarus Kalin was born March 12, 1921, in Perry, a small town southeast of Tallahassee, Florida. At the age of two, his family moved back to Asheville NC, his mother's hometown. Shortly thereafter they relocated to nearby Hendersonville, which Ed always regarded as his hometown. From the early age of eight, he worked in his father's clothing store folding clothes and also worked in his uncle's furniture store when he was 13.

He graduated from Henderson High School in 1938, and subsequently entered the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he was a member of TEP fraternity.

America's involvement in WWII commenced while he was a senior at UNC. He was inducted into the Navy and commissioned as an ensign. Upon graduation from UNC in June 1941 with a BS in business administration, accounting, and marketing, he traveled to Cambridge Massachusetts where he enrolled in a naval supply school at Harvard. He enjoyed saying that he was a “Haahvard man.” After graduation, he was stationed at Parris Island where he was placed in charge of payroll. He was subsequently transferred to the Philippines, stationed on the island of Cavite, where he again served as a paymaster.

Following the surrender of Japan in 1945 Edward returned to the United States, honorably discharged with the rank of lieutenant SG (Senior Grade).

He briefly returned to North Carolina but then partnered with his cousins Maurice Rothman and his wife Thelma Pearlman Rothman, opening Kane's Furniture in St. Petersburg Florida, in 1948. He was introduced in 1950 to Alyce Weiss in Miami and they were married a few months later. They remained married for 56 years until Alyce's death in 2006. Together they opened Kane's Furniture in Sarasota at the corner of Orange Avenue and Ringling Boulevard. Larger and more sophisticated stores followed, with the largest store at 120,000 sq. ft. at US 41 and Phillippi Creek. The store, with its prominent blue tiled roof, is currently the site of Furniture Warehouse. The Kane store name was changed to Kalin's Furniture in 2013. They were joined in the business by son Jeffrey as a merchandise manager and daughter Leslie, an interior designer, providing many jobs in multiple domains of fine furnishings, carpeting and interior design.

Even in the most trying economic times, Ed kept the business going for the benefit of his staff. He knew each and every member of his staff and maintained a genuine interest in their well-being.

Ed and Alice joined Temple Beth Sholom from the time of their arrival in Sarasota in 1950 and were the 49th members to join. He was an active member, serving on the board of directors, and was directly involved with each stage of expansion of the synagogue. The administrative wing in the religious center is named in honor of Alyce and Edward Kalin.





He has been recognized at all the major TBS milestone celebratory events, culminating with the Pioneers Recognition event at TBS in late January 2020. He was 97 at the celebration, just a few weeks short of his 98th birthday and the lockdown due to the Covid pandemic.

Alyce and Ed were recognized as patrons of the arts and were philanthropists of local, national, and international causes. Ed was also particularly passionate about support for the State of Israel and used

to say that if he was younger he would like to join the IDF.

In the early 1960s, Ed recognized the potential of the burgeoning real estate market. His legendary reputation for honesty and integrity made him a sought-after advisor and investor.

Ed maintained an office in the Miramar building on Palm Avenue, at the age of 95, continuing to manage his real estate investments despite the closing of Kalin's.

He was revered and much loved by his family, and was regarded by all who knew him as a true mensch. His daughter Leslie Malkin notes: "My father was a true southern gentleman who was loved and revered by many. How lucky was I to have had him as a father for so many years. He was fond of saying, 'It doesn't cost anything to be nice and it pays dividends'. He was constant in this belief and lived by it every day until the end. His memory is a blessing. Bye-bye for now "Papa!"

Evan Danzig, grandson, comments: "You either loved Ed Kalin or you didn't know him, and there weren't many people who didn't know him in the Sarasota community. I never viewed my Pop as a grandfather as he always just felt like a best friend. I feel truly lucky and blessed to have had him in my life." Jeffrey Kalin, his son, notes: "One amazing thing about my father, Edward Kalin, was that he loved his life. He never had a negative thing to say about his parents, his brothers or his upbringing. He loved the small town he grew up in and spoke glowingly about his college years and the time spent in the Navy. He remembered fondly all the relatives he interacted with throughout his life.

His memory was excellent about even the smallest details, from his first car to his roommates in college, etc. He didn't exactly say it but you could tell that he felt his entire life was charmed and he enjoyed and appreciated every aspect of it. He knew so many people and inherited from his father a genuine interest in talking and getting to know people from all walks of life, from business meeting partners to total strangers he'd meet window shopping at the mall. He was truly one of a kind."

Edward passed away on June 9, 2022, at the age of 101. He is predeceased by his parents Samuel and Ray Kalin, his wife Alyce of 56 years, and his brother Sidney. He is survived by his brother Barry (Lois), son Jeffrey (Suzy), his daughter Leslie Malkin (Marc Cohen), his grandchildren Evan Danzig (Carly), Nathan and Rachael Kalin and his great-granddaughter Dakota Danzig.

Edward Kalin was a pillar of Temple Beth Congregation, a philanthropist and benefactor to many organizations in Sarasota, regionally and nationally. He will be forever remembered by all those who came in contact with him and knew him.

BOOK REVIEWS

November 2, 2022 — Esta Snider will review **People Love Dead Jews: Reports From a Haunted Present** by Dara Horn, 2021; co-sponsored with Sisterhood — A startling and profound exploration of how Jewish history is exploited to appease the living. Reflecting on subjects such as the international veneration of Anne Frank, the author challenges us to confront the reasons why there might be so much fascination with Jewish deaths, as emblematic of the worst of evils the world has to offer, and so little respect for Jewish lives, as they continue to unfold in the present.

December 7, 2022 — Sue Spector will review **The Third Daughter** by Talia Carner, 2019 — The turn of the 20th century finds fourteen-year-old Batya in the Russian countryside, fleeing with her Jewish family from endless pogroms. Desperate, her father leaps at the opportunity to marry Batya to a worldly, wealthy stranger who can guarantee his daughter an easy life and passage to America. Her new “husband” brings her to Buenos Aires and now Batya is one of thousands of women tricked and sold into prostitution. A powerful story, inspired by little-known true events, of finding courage in the face of danger, and hope in the face of despair, **The Third Daughter** brings to life a dark period of Jewish history and gives a voice to victims whose truth deserves to finally be told.

FILM MATINEES

November 16, 2022 — **The Jewish Cardinal** — 2013, 100 min., French (English subtitles) – This film tells the amazing true story of Jean-Marie Lustiger, the son of Polish-Jewish immigrants, who maintained his cultural identity as a Jew even after converting to Catholicism, joining the priesthood, and rising within the ranks of the Church to become Archbishop of Paris.

December 21, 2022 — Fiddler: A Miracle of Miracles — 2019, 97 min. — This documentary chronicles the story of the international Broadway blockbuster **Fiddler on the Roof** by exploring the richness of its themes as well as its extensive reach across time and cultures. It features rare archival footage and interviews with musical luminaries such as Joel Grey, Topol, Itzhak Perlman, and Stephen Sondheim, and explores a variety of international productions, detailing how individuals of many cultures see themselves.

January 18, 2023 – 93Queen, 2018, 90 min. — This film follows a group of tenacious Hasidic women who create the first all-female volunteer ambulance corps in New York to provide dignified emergency medical care to the Hasidic women and girls of Borough Park, Brooklyn, where the EMS corps Hatzolah has steadfastly banned women from its ranks. The film follows the formation and launch of Ezras Nashim through the organization's first year and shows a unique portrayal of empowered women who are taking matters into their own hands to change their community from within.

NEW BOOKS IN THE ALCOVE

The Netanyahus: An Account of a Minor and Ultimately Even Negligible Episode in the History of a Very Famous Family by Joshua Cohen, 2021 – winner of the 2022 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. This novel centers on a fictionalized account of Harold Bloom's encounter with Benzion Netanyahu and his family, including his son, Benjamin Netanyahu, at an upstate New York college in the late 1950s, blending history, fiction, and humor.

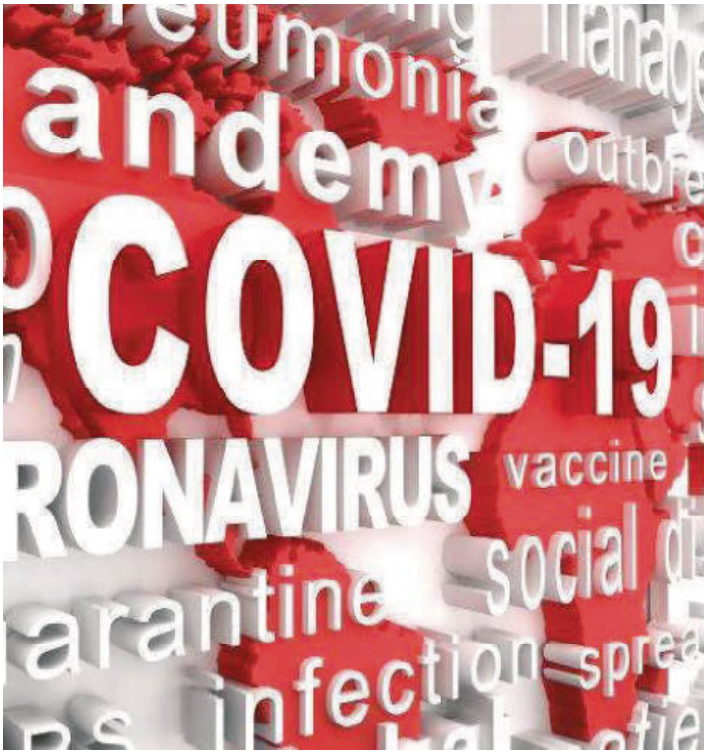

His latest book, co-authored with Alex Pomson, is *Jewish Day Schools: Leadership, Learning and Community* (2022).

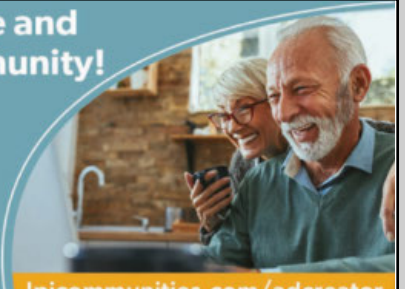

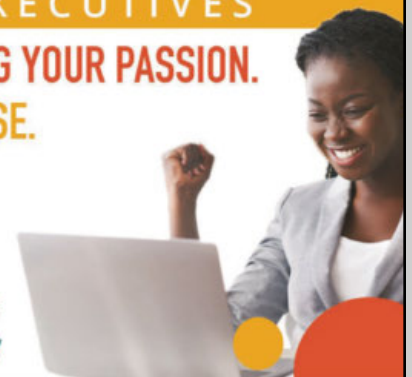

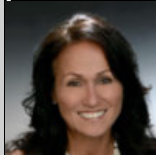
