VAYIKRA With the Mishkan complete, God calls to Moses to explain the sacrificial system. The first type of sacrifice is the burnt (olah) offering, which could be an animal in a range of varying costs which was not eaten. The grain (mincha) offering was a less expensive option. The well-being (zevach) offering, by contrast, is mostly eaten by the priests and the Israelite who donated the animal. Finally, the parasha introduces the purification (hattat) offerings for unintentional sins and sins of omission, as well as reparation (asham) offerings, which are brought for sins against the Sanctuary, for deceit with false oaths and for contingency. These offerings are treated with great care by the ancient priests and Levites, who provide the ritual conduit between the people and God. The ceremonies surrounding the offerings are operated with precision. When executed properly, these actions please God greatly.


