RABBI'S MESSAGE



It is no secret that we are approaching the High Holiday season, which is referred to in Hebrew as Yamim Noraim, the days of amazement. These days, as with all the Jewish holidays, are best experienced if one first does preparation to be ready for the day. This preparation, of course, includes physical preparation. We prepare special foods like round challah and honey and apples. Many people break out their good dishes and special family recipes. Some may even buy new clothes for the occasion.

In addition to the physical preparations, there is spiritual and emotional preparation that helps one find more meaning in the days. To prepare for Rosh Hashanah we are expected to evaluate our behaviors from the past year and make amends to others whom we have harmed. This step is seen as integral to the process of change and needs to be carried out before we seek forgiveness from God.

Even though our services on the Yamim Noraim are longer than normal, the preparations can, and should, take more time than the rituals themselves. This is made clear with the ritual of Tashlich. I often compare Tashlich to an archer shooting a bow and arrow. She pulls back the bow, steadies her arm, takes aim and then, when she releases the bow, the arrow quickly, almost instantaneously, hits the target. Tashlich is like this as well. We spend a good amount of time thinking about what we want to “cast away” and then when we finally engage in the act, at the edge of the water, it is a quick second and done. That act, however, would not have the significance it carries without the initial preparation.

Tashlich, the symbolic casting away of our transgressions, misdeeds, and aspects of ourselves we wish to discard, has taken on various forms over the generations. Early on, there was a belief that the best way to win favor from evil spirits living in the water were to give them gifts. In the Babylonian tradition, people sent “sin-filled” containers out into the water. Sometimes before Rosh Hashanah, people would grow beans or peas in a woven basket for each child in a family. Then, the basket, representing the child, was swung around the head seven times and flung into the water. Kurdistan Jews even threw themselves into the water and swam around to be cleansed of their transgressions. While some rabbinic opinions suggest not using bread, there is a prevalent custom to toss bread crumbs into a body of water to carry out this ritual. It is normally done on the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah but can be done any time between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

This year, please join us at Siesta Key Beach on Sunday, October 6 at 6:00 pm for Tashlich. Bring a picnic dinner and some beach chairs (and of course some bread crumbs). We will do our preparations for the ritual and then head to the water’s edge to cast away our transgressions. We will also have the opportunity to enjoy the sunset and the Siesta Key Drum Circle. For our younger participants, this will coincide with a PJ Library event which will include crafts, some snacks, and PJ Library story time. We hope you and your families will join us.

As you all go through your preparations for the Yamim Noraim, my family and I wish you all a Shanah Tovah u’Metukah, a sweet and good New Year.

As we have been doing almost every Saturday morning since the beginning of my term as President of TBS, Edith and I attended services yesterday at the Temple. It was an inspiring experience. In the summer our attendance is down somewhat from what it is during the “season,” but it is very respectable. I would guess there were between 80 and 100 people in the chapel. Almost all of them stayed after the service for a delicious Kiddish.

Those who come on Shabbat morning, just as those who attend the morning minyan every day, and those who attend Friday evening Shabbat services are like a family. When someone is not there, they are missed and people get concerned and wonder if they are OK. Our community cares and looks out for each other.

The service was very spiritual and musical. Every week, people come over to tell me how wonderful our services are and how they enjoy being part of the Temple Beth Sholom community. Occasionally, we get a special treat as we did this week with a musical duet sung by Cantor Neil and Saranee Newman. We also took the opportunity this week to say goodbye to Cantor Aaron and Shoshana Marcus who are leaving Sarasota and moving to Maryland to be closer to their family. You may recall that Cantor Marcus was wonderful in leading our High Holiday services last year. We wish them well as they start the next chapter of their life experience.

Regarding future programming, I want to call your attention to the Scholar-in-Residence program that TBS will be sponsoring on the weekend of November 8-10. You may say it's a little early to be thinking about November, but I want you to put this one on your calendar now. Our Scholar will be Dr. Kenneth Stein, professor of contemporary Middle Eastern history, political science, and Israeli studies at Emory University. Ken has taught at Emory since 1977. He is the Founding Director of the Emory Institute for the Study of Modern Israel. He will speak at Friday night Shabbat services, Saturday morning during the service, after the Kiddish at the schmooze, and on Sunday morning in conjunction with the Men's Club breakfast. More details will follow in coming months on the topics to be covered.

Our Continuing Education team led by Al Treidel, Rabbi Ed Weinsberg, Eric Faerber, and their committees are putting together an exceptional array of programming for the coming year that will enhance our knowledge of many Jewish subjects and will entertain us with Klezmer and Israeli music as well. Keep an eye out for the program schedule.

As a reminder, tickets for the TBS Concert at the Opera House featuring Cantor Azi Schwartz will be on sale to TBS members when you receive this issue of the Messenger. TBS members are getting the first opportunity to buy tickets, but ticket sales will be open to public purchase in early September. So do not procrastinate. 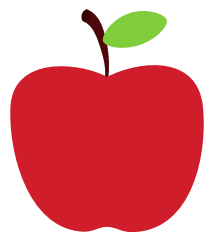

LIFE & LEGACY SPOTLIGHT



Sandi Kligman

After spending a couple of winters locally, and selling a business in New Jersey, Sandi Kligman and her late husband Mel moved to Sarasota full-time in 1990. They were attracted by the weather, cultural offerings, and growing Jewish community. By 1992, they joined Temple Beth Sholom. Although they were more traditional than religious, both had always belonged to “Conservadox” synagogues and were comfortable with the Hebrew prayer and services at TBS. Even though they did not attend weekly, they were both raised to feel a strong obligation to support a temple for those who do.

Sandi grew up in the Weequahic section of Newark and then West Orange, New Jersey. Her four grandparents and Mel's parents all immigrated to the United States. Today, Sandi has family in Israel and England. As a lifelong Zionist, she's been fortunate to make 34 extended visits to Israel over more than 50 years... She and Mel started dating on an Israel Bonds New Leadership Mission in 1980.

From youth group BBG Regional President at 16 to Vice-President of their congregation in New Jersey, Sandi held many leadership positions in Jewish organizations. When she moved to Sarasota, she promised to “stop raising her hand”. At the start of the Second Intifada, she was president of their Homeowner's Association and president of the Gulf Coast Women's Golf Association when she realized she needed to change gears. Having always been part of a Hadassah family, she joined the SaBra Chapter. She also served as Fundraising VP for the Florida Region and on the Development Council for Southeast Hadassah.

Sandi said, “I'm very proud of and grateful to all the TBS members who helped Hadassah in Sarasota literally raise millions for the Emergency Center and Davidson Tower at the Ein Kerem Hospital in Jerusalem and whose names are engraved on the walls.”

More recently, Sandi served on the Boards of both Temple Beth Sholom and Sisterhood. She said she knows first-hand how fortunate we are to have so many members (and our amazing staff) put in enormous amounts of time and talent to make TBS the vibrant and welcoming home we all enjoy.

She further said that “simchas and holidays aside, I can't emphasize enough how important being part of the Temple Beth Sholom family is when you need their support and services. Certainly it was moving and comforting to me when Mel passed away suddenly and Rabbi Werbow reached out to me in Spain. Knowing that the TBS Cemetery is such a peaceful and lovingly maintained resting place also truly eased my heart. We often use the phrase ‘give until it hurts’ but my work with Hadassah taught me the joy of helping people find a way to fund a meaningful gift, one that is comfortably within their means and makes the donor happy!”

When asked why she is now a participant in the Life and Legacy Program, she said “the Life & Legacy Program is such a wonderful opportunity for every congregant to help insure the future and enhanced continuity of Temple Beth Sholom... Everyone's circumstances are different: outright gifts are easier for some and estate gifts better suited to others. There is great flexibility and different vehicles in the Life & Legacy program, and expert, individual advice available through the TBS Committee. I think there's a misconception that Life & Legacy is just for the wealthy: so if you've ever sat in synagogue, heard the program mentioned and thought I'd love to do something for TBS but this is beyond me, I encourage you to please seek out personalized, confidential details. It can feel good to give!”

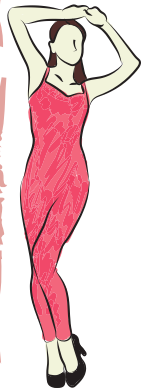

JUDAICA SHOP

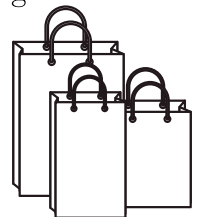

SAVE THE DATE! Youth Opera: Brundibar Sunday, Nov. 17, 7:00 pm

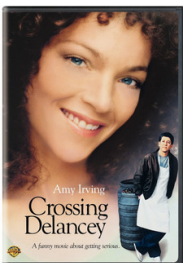
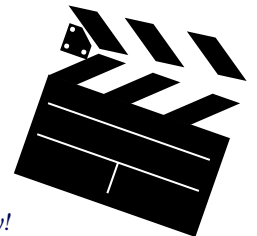

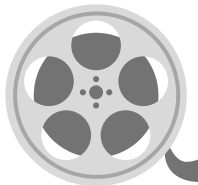

We have three very special Lunch and Learn courses and an incredible 4-part lecture series that will take place in January. The Lunch and Learn courses are:

Nov. 7, 14, 21 and Dec. 5 Heroes of the Holocaust with Al Treidel : January 2020 marks the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II and the liberation of the Concentration Camps. Much time and effort has been expended in chronicling the horrors of the Holocaust. The thrust of this three-session course will focus on those groups and individuals who either fought the Nazis on behalf of the Jews and/or helped to rescue Jews from the Shoah. We will learn about several extraordinary Jews who serve as special role models for us even today. We will focus on both Jewish fighters and resistance leaders along with a sampling of many of the righteous gentiles who saved Jews. Some of the stories may be familiar while others will serve as eye-openers.

Feb. 6, 13, 20 and 27: Jewish Justices of the Supreme Court: Their Lives and Legacies with Judge Judith Barzilay. Some of the most influential Jews in American History served as Supreme Court Justices. This 4-part series will focus on these gifted individuals and how they played significant roles in the lives of Americans. Each session will focus on a specific theme. The themes are: The Pioneers: Brandeis and Cardozo; The Double Tragedy: Goldberg and Fortas; The Enigma and Influence of Felix Frankfurter; The Moderns: Ginsberg, Breyer and Kagan.

Lest We Forget: Anti-Semitism and Holocaust Awareness Lecture Series with Dr. Andre Krauss. Jan. 9, 16, 23 & 30 – 11:00 am – 12:15pm – TBS Social Hall.

This 4-part lecture series is in support of the 2020 Butterflies of Hope and Remembrance to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the liberation of the Nazi Concentration Camps. Dr. Krauss is an eminent authority on this dark period of Jewish History and will offer insights that will provide us with a better understanding of the dynamics of the Shoah. Each lecture presentation will be delivered in a multi-media and inter-active mode. The titles of the four lecture presentations are: Cultural Origins of Anti-Semitism; Jewish Resistance in Europe During the Holocaust; Inside Hitler's Head: The Psychodynamics of Nazi Anti-Semitism; Anti-Semitism, Holocaust Denial, and the Importance of Holocaust Education.

STUDENTS CONTINUE COMMITMENT TO TIKKUN OLAM

Thanks to this year's rising sixth graders, the students at the Hershorin Schiff Community Day School will be taking better care of the planet while caring for the school garden. Last year, the class appealed to head of school Dan Ceaser, writing a letter requesting a flow meter to monitor water use. With Ceaser's approval, the flow meter was purchased and installed.

The project came about as the fifth and sixth-grade students were working on project-based learning topics about the environment. The fifth-graders focused on "Earth's Water"; the sixth-graders on "Animals Living in Our Environment." Due to student interest and concern, teacher Joannie Bloch redirected studies to include red tide, its impacts, and how human behavior might contribute to its proliferation.

During a scientific learning expedition to UF/IFAS (University of Florida, Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences) Extension Sarasota County, students participated in three hands-on outdoor labs about plankton energy flow, nitrogen testing, and the local watershed. The labs helped students come to conclusions about how human behaviors impact the environment.

Upon learning that excess runoff creates extra chemicals in our waterways – which contributes to algal blooms that aid in the production of red tide – the students began measuring the water use in their own homes, with the goal of finding ways to be more efficient. The project carried over to the school; the fifth-graders decided to write to their head of school and plead their case for monitoring water use in the "Papa Ed and Mimi Rosenthal Organic Kibbutz Sustainability Garden and Outdoor Classroom."

Ed "Papa" and Betty "Mimi" Rosenthal have been the sponsors of the garden since 2010. Through the agriculture curriculum at Community Day, students learn, explore and contribute to a cleaner, greener Sarasota. Food grown in the garden is used in school meals and has also fed the hungry served by area social service nonprofits. The garden – which is pesticide-free and has maximized opportunities for water conservation – produces everything from kale, watermelon, sunflowers and collards to cotton, tomatoes, cucumbers and herbs.

Community Day Head of School, Dan Ceaser, said "I am so proud of our students, who are tireless in looking for ways they can have a positive impact."

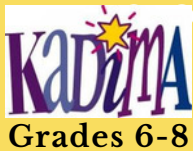

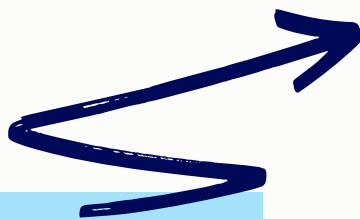
