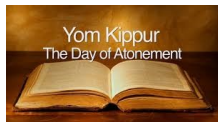

## YOM KIPPUR

. . . *In the seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, you shall afflict your souls, and you shall not do any work . . . for on that day He shall provide atonement for you to cleanse yourself from all your transgressions before the Lord.* -**Leviticus 16:29-30**. The name “Yom Kippur” means “Day of Atonement”. It is a day set aside to “afflict the soul” to atone for the transgressions of the past year. On Yom Kippur, the judgement entered into the book is sealed. This day is, essentially, your last appeal, your last chance to change the judgement, to demonstrate your repentance and make amends. Yom Kippur atones only for transgressions between man and God, not for transgressions against another person. To atone for transgressions against another person, you must first seek reconciliation with that person, righting the wrongs you committed against them if possible. That must all be done before Yom Kippur. No work can be performed on that day. The Talmud specifies additional less well-known restrictions. You are supposed to refrain from eating and drinking (even water) on Yom Kippur. It is a complete, 25-hour fast beginning before sunset on the evening before Yom Kippur and ending after nightfall on the day of Yom Kippur. As always, any of these restrictions can be lifted where a threat of life or health is involved. It is customary to wear white on the holiday, which symbolizes purity and calls to mind the promise that our transgressions shall be made white as snow.
